Why a Thermographic Evaluation?

Save money? Manage risk?



How is this done?

- Initial thermographic images of equipment are captured and documented by industry certified RMC personnel.
- Images are compared to equipment manufacturer's specifications and a baseline established.
- Subsequent images are taken at scheduled intervals and compared to the baselines.
